(1) A taxpayer may elect to donate all or part of their overpayment to any of the listed city projects.

(2) The taxpayer is limited to donating their entire overpayment to only one city project if multiple projects are listed.

(3) Taxpayer can donate all or part of their income tax overpayment to any of three causes of their choosing and in any dollar amount limited to the total income tax overpayment. The donation can be split between up to three causes. Contribution amount is reported in boxes 28a, 28b and 28c with the total amount reported in box 28d. The taxpayer must report the amount for each donation along with the legal name, complete address and Federal Employer Identification Number on Attachment 22, Supporting Notes and Statements.
